The sophomore struck out 10 batters and recorded the first nine Rialto outs via strikeout en route to an 8-2 win over the visiting Knights on Thursday in the first round of the CIF Southern Section Division 4 playoffs.

"Being a sophomore and being able to pitch the first round of CIF, it's such a blessing," Stoner said. "There was pressure but I know my team, if I mess up, can pick me up. So that relieves the pressure.'

La Canada won its fifth straight game and improved to 19-6. The Spartans will host highlyrated Buena in Tuesday's second round. Rialto finished 20-9.

The Spartans have taken flight in recent weeks after they turned a close race with Temple City in the Rio Hondo League into a league championship with two dominating wins in the final week of the season. The momentum has clearly carried over to the playoffs.
